email: BRING YOUR PERSONAL PLANNING CALENDARS TO THE MEETING. Proposed dates for club activities were suggested in that memo.





All the best and I look forward to hearing back from you.



MX-5 maintenance

How to Remove Your Car From Long Term Storage

When you prepare your car for long-term storage, you do your best to protect it during its idle months by taking certain steps involving fluids, parts, and such. Understand how to remove your car from long-term storage when you are ready to drive it again to ensure its transition back onto the road goes smoothly.

Steps

- Air out your car. Lower your car if you put it up on blocks when you put it into long-term storage. Then remove the vehicle cover and open the windows. This helps get rid of any musty smell. You can also remove any mothballs you placed in your vehicle.
- 2 Check your battery by making sure the connections and posts are free of any corrosion that can build up over time. Electronics can quickly drain battery power, so have a plan in place in case your battery is dead. If you put your car on a trickle charger when you put it into long-term storage, remove that. Do what you need to so that your battery is fully charged, even if that means getting a new one.
- 3 Prepare your car for driving. Many of the things you did to prepare your car for longterm storage helped, but they may not have prevented leaks or other damage. Before you start it back up, it is important that you look over your car to see if there is anything wrong. Check the engine. Make sure belts and hoses are not damaged. Change any dirty filters. Look for nests that birds or mice may have built during your car's time in storage. Look at your fluid levels of oil, water, brake fluid, windshield washer fluid, coolant, and power-steering fluid. Change or add more if needed. If one is particularly low, look for puddles underneath your car to see if it leaks. Check the pressure of your tires. Adjust as needed to get them back to normal. Put windshield wipers back on your car.

- Start the engine. Let your car run for 20 minutes in order to warm up. Look for any warning lights on your dashboard. Also, check the brake pedal to make sure it feels normal. The brakes could respond noisily after storage if rust accumulated on your car's brake rotors. This brake noise is normal and should go away quickly.
- Wash your car. Though your car was no doubt clean when you put it into storage, chances are it gained some dirt during the storage period. When you remove your car from long-term storage, give it a thorough washing. Take special care to wash the underside of your car, as dirt can build up there as well.
- Take your car for a drive. Driving it around for an hour or so will help you ensure all systems are working properly. It also lets your car get back up to normal temperature after sitting in storage for an extended period. Be sure to take the first few miles slowly. It is normal for your car to make some unusual sounds until it gets properly warmed up.



Food for thought...

1990 Miata Owner Takes on Microsoft!

The owner of an original 1990 Mazda Miata attended a recent computer expo. where the motivational guest speaker was extolling the virtues of the most recent Windows version, just launched that day. As his speech reached the moment for thunderous applause, he shouted out, "If the car industry had kept up with technology the way the computer industry has, we would all be driving \$25 cars that got 1,000 miles to the gallon!" Most of the crowd erupted with wild cheering and fist bumping. The Miata owner mused, "I've been driving the same car for 29 years. It has all of its original equipment. I've had flawless performance, with no worries of breakdown." After reflecting on his love for his Mazda Miata, he wrote to the executive at Microsoft:

If Mazda had developed technology like Microsoft, we would all be driving cars with the following characteristics:

- 1. For no reason whatsoever, your car would crash ... twice a day.
- 2. Occasionally your car would die on the freeway for no reason. You would have to pull to the side of the road, close all of the windows, shut off the car, restart it, and reopen the windows before you could continue. For some reason, you would simply accept this.
- 3. Occasionally, executing a maneuver such as a left turn would cause your car to shut down and refuse to restart, in which case you would have to reinstall the engine.
- 4. Macintosh would make a car that was

powered by the sun, was reliable, five times as fast and twice as easy to drive - but would run on only five percent of the roads.

- 5. The oil, water temperature, and alternator warning lights would all be replaced by a single "This Car Has Performed An Illegal Operation" warning light.

The base MX-5 Sport also gains a 7-inch infotainment system as standard equipment for 2018...along with a slight price increase of \$395 over the 2017 model – not bad considering you had to step up to the Club trim at \$29,675 to get the same infotainment system before.

New colours are out there for 2018 as well, including a sweet looking maroon-coloured rag top. If you were a fan of the RF-exclusive Machine Gray paint, then you'll be happy to learn it's available for the soft top now too.

Mazda Miata Rated "Most Satisfying" By Sports Car Owners

Surveys by owners of the Mazda
Miata put it on the same list as the
Corvette, 911, Model S, and Dodge Challenger.
The Mazda Miata has just earned a "Top Ten Most
Satisfying Cars" position on the most recent
Consumer Reports list. The Miata joins cars like
the Tesla Model S, Chevrolet Corvette, Porshe 911
and Dodge Challenger on this esteemed list of cars
that bring smiles and satisfaction to their owners.
Unlike many of Consumer Reports subjective
ratings based on the opinion of its editorial staff,
this list is based on survey results of all cars by

actual owners. It asks such questions as "Would you buy this car again" to get an understanding of how satisfied with the ownership experience those who paid their own money for the vehicle are. In its summary of the Miata and its win, Consumer Reports pointed out a few aspects of the car that may contribute to its high ranking. Consumer Reports lists, "...the delightfully accurate six-speed manual shifter..." and "Quick and precise steering delivers sublime back-road handling..." and notes that, "Flipping the convertible top open or closed is a breeze." Because this is Consumer Reports, the publication also added this convertible also comes with, "High levels of noise, thin and unsupportive seats, and a stiff ride all grow fatiguing during highway travel." As if Miata owners cared less. Consumer Reports also notes that in the subcompact Miata sports car, "Cabin space is snug." Insightful. The Miata RF and Miata soft top have had a banner year of sales in 2017 and heads into 2018 with some refreshing new looks.

MAZDA MX-5 MIATA CLUB RF REVIEW: A FOUR-SEASON ROADSTER

Targa or topless, the MX-5 alwaus delivers

We've had nothing but praise for the new Mazda MX-5. It offers such a straightforward no-extras sports car experience that I don't think there's much anybody could credibly complain about. The first and biggest challenge facing the RF, then, is -- as with the Fiat 124 Spider -- to simply not screw things up. The RF doesn't screw things up, but it's definitely something of an acquired taste. It's kind of cool, but it doesn't feel like an essential, necessary addition to the MX-5 lineup. I don't hate it, but a part of me wonders why it exists.

A disclaimer: Porsche's new 911 Targa flat out rubs me the wrong way. Its super-complicated robo-top

obliterates the lightweight simplicity of the original removable roof panel. Pricey and heavy, it's a targa in name only.

Why is relevant? Because wouldn't be fair to let this curious, Porsche-like take on the power-targa setup off the hook completely, but it doesn't make me furious.

For one, it's the only way to get into a hardtop ND MX-5 (at this point, at least -- a real coupe would be delightful). And with the hardtop comes a noticeably different driving experience. The car seems to corner flatter, with less body roll, yet it's no harsher to drive than the convertible.

It's quieter, too. I'm not going to complain about wind noise in a Miata; that would be ridiculous. But if I could pick this or a ragtop for a long road trip, I'd be in this hands-down. The interior is more serene than the convertible, but the open-air experience is just a few seconds away. And yeah, for what it is, the top is a trick piece of hardware. The manual convertible top is beautiful for its simplicity and ease of use, but the RF's mechanism is mesmerizing -- and can be operated at a medium-duration stoplight.

As to which one I'd rather own? Assuming I can't cop out and say 124 Spider Abarth with the optional Monza exhaust, I'd lean toward the ragtop. The MX-5 is pretty much perfect as-is, and its wonderfully engineered manually actuated cloth top is a thing of functional beauty. Generally, though, I prefer hardtops -- a point for the RF. I'm not sure I'd want to have those buttresses lurking in my peripheral vision all the time, though.

OTHER VOICES:

I won't dwell upon my well-documented affection for the current MX-5, which (especially in Club

trim) is just about perfect in my eyes; So let's pretend you've decided on a Miata, but are wondering whether to pick the robo-targa model or the classic roadster:



It comes down to where you live and what you're going to do with your car. Sunny SoCal weekend toy? Go get the roadster and enjoy. If you see much rain or snow, the RF needs a close look, though the regular soft top does a pretty good job of

sealing out the elements too.
Yes, the RF is a little heavier than the regular Miata Club (about 113 lbs), but it does offer a bit of extra weather protection; more significantly, there's a reduced sense of impending death-by-SUV when you're on crowded roads, though the structural benefits are more perception than reality.

Which brings us to the question of track days and high-performance driving events (HPDE): You might think the RF would preclude the need for an aftermarket rollbar, but it appears that's not the case (or at least there's a lot of confusion about it). In fact, the RF's packaging may prevent the installation of more aggressive rollover protection of the type available for roadsters, yet it isn't enough by itself to satisfy some event hosts -- in other words, you could be stuck with a Miata you can't take to your local track day, and that would be just about criminal.

For me, living in a four-season locale for the forseeable future, the RF makes a lot of sense. But the \$6K premium plus the track-day rule ambiguity means it's soft-top MX-5 or nothing.

STIFFER, QUIETER, CALMER

The market for sports cars has eroded recently, and nearly every two-seat convertible sports machine has taken a big hit -- most are down by double-digit sales since 2015. But Mazda's classic ...

Personally I'd go with a soft top Miata were it my money, but that's just me. I got no beefs with this car.

It's always refreshing to get back into a Miata. It's so easy to drive quickly. Fancy top or soft top the car simply has excellent balance and handling and points like a go-kart with quick steering. The ride is compliant and the structure rock solid. The MX-5 just eggs you on to get out there and have some fun. Off the top of my head I can't think of a better combination out there. Oh, and the top couldn't be easier to operate: Hold the little toggle switch on the dash for about 10 seconds. There. You're done. It's as close to the perfect car as we get these days, I'd argue. Here's a tidbit: Even in these SUV-crazed times Miata sales are up 34.5 percent this year. It's among the few passenger cars showing an increase.

Mazda's EVs won't lose their zoom, Moro says

DETROIT — Electrified vehicles are on the horizon for Mazda.

When they arrive, don't expect boring creations. Even in an electrified age, Mazda's determination to build fun-to-drive vehicles won't change, said Masahiro Moro, CEO of Mazda North American Operations. The automaker is stacking the building blocks now for an electrified future. Its Skyactiv-X engine, slated for a 2019 rollout, is a key piece in Mazda's effort to curb CO2 emissions.

Moro said Skyactiv-X will be an "important base engine to add electrification" to the Mazda lineup. The "base engine has to be efficient first, then we are able to add hybrid on top of that," he said. Moro added that Mazda is preparing "a pure battery EV" to comply with California's zero-emission vehicle mandate.


He said it'll be up to engineers to rise to the challenge and retain Mazda's fun factor in an electrified vehicle.

"Our engineers will enjoy another new challenge to make an EV to be a true Mazda with driving performance. That's what customers expect from Mazda," Moro told *Automotive News*.

Amid the EV effforts, he said, Mazda will continue to pull every bit of potential from the internal combustion engine.

Mazda — with its lineup of crossovers, sedans, a sporty hatchback and the MX-5 Miata roadster — has been a perennial leader in fuel economy. The EPA listed the company as having the highest overall "manufacturer adjusted fuel economy" for the 2016 model year — the fifth year in a row Mazda led the industry. The company said its overall average fuel economy was 29.6 mpg, which improved by 0.4 mpg over the previous year.

The automaker's commitment to efficient gasoline engines will continue with Skyactiv-X. Combining characteristics of diesel engines and conventional gasoline engines, Skyactiv-X uses spark plug ignition "to control compression ignition, resulting in dramatic improvements across a range of important performance indicators."

An old school sports car, in more ways than one

It's of common knowledge that, if you're planning on using someone else's chassis to base your new sports car on, you can't go far wrong with a Mazda MX-5. With one of the finest-balanced setups at this end of the market, the current incarnation of the MX-5 in particular is a great platform to build on - as Fiat and Abarth have already found with their 124 Spider variants. Soon, though, another Mazda MX-5-based







have with each other does increase the likelihood of an RF-based Mitsuoka being green-lit at some point. Not that it'll mean much for us here in North America, considering Mitsuoka won't be selling any Roadster variant here.

cylinder gasoline engine set to be carried over to the Mitsuoka. It was also confirmed that the hand-crafted exterior won't be a drastic evolution over the current car's bodywork - so expect an aesthetic to be reminiscent of a Morgan Aero 8 that's been left in the tumble dryer for too long. That said, the changes that have been made will follow function over form. For instance, whereas the current Mitsuoka Roadster has fake hood vents, the 2018 car will have legit ones. Perhaps the most intriguing aspect of the new



Mitsuoka Roadster we were able to ascertain, though, was that the car likely won't be exclusively available as a soft-top. Allegedly, a Mitsuoka Roadster variant based on the Mazda MX-5 RF, complete with that car's folding hard top roof, is being considered. Though the representatives we spoke to did stress nothing had been confirmed, the strong and respectful working relationship Mazda and Mitsuoka

Toyota and Mazda Want a Sweetheart Deal Like Tesla's For New Factory

Jobs for sale is the new reality in America. Toyota and Mazda want Tesla money for new factory. Toyota and Mazda are shopping for a new factory and offering 4,000 direct jobs, plus many more in local supporting jobs to the state that brings the biggest bag of cash to the table. Surprised? Don't be. Tesla demanded cash, not just tax breaks when it shopped its Gigafactory around the non-UAW

states in the west. As Governor Jerry Brown of California found out the hard way, Tesla wasn't bluffing. Nevada ultimately made Tesla the best offer.

Bloomberg and other sources are suggesting that Toyota and Mazda want \$1 Billion in total incentives to bring the new joint factory to the lucky state that antes up. This latest step by Toyota to "In-source" jobs to America is no surprise. Toyota has been moving the production of the cars, crossovers, and trucks it builds into the U.S. for generations.
