Happy Canada Day!



9am Registration and light breakfast at Orillia Mazda


10am Depart Orillia



Following our meal we all split into foursomes being careful NOT to pair up


husbands and wives and all enjoyed a round of mini golf.

How many miles/kilometers has your MX-5 traveled?

We're not all that surprised - MX-5
Miatas are incredibly reliable.


I bought in new in 1990. Since then I have changed the clutch 3 times (I will be proactively changing it again in a few months) All the wheel bearings once, one timing belt change, twice replaced the starter, three alternator changes shortly after changing the stereo, changed all the incandecent lights to LED's and that stopped. No work has been done on the engine and drive train except what I've stated and a "temporary" repair I did to the lower timing belt sprocket keyway and ~230,000 miles. I've since outfitted the machine with a dash-cam and replaced the rear overload bumpers with air bags to assist in towing (for about four years I routinely used the MX-5 to tow a half ton of batteries about three times a week to and from jobs, hint: My clutch lasted less than 100,000 miles during that time) I've done all the work myself and have extensive records showing the parts I've purchased from time to time with the occasional trip to a dealer or shop to have the injectors cleaned, etc.

It still surprises me every time I put the key in the ignition and it runs. Anyway, I'm committed now. Have to see it through to half a mil just for the bragging rights before I move on.



Honorable Mention?

Why is a Million Mile Miata an Honorable Mention and not the lead story? Frankly, its because we're having such a hard time believing its real.



Dan Masterson's red 1992 Miata has been through the hands of 9 different owners, as well as being used by teenagers and for a courier delivery job. It is literally almost never in the driveway. One of the previous owners also made regular trips from coast to coast in the United States.

This car has had 12 timing belt changes over two engines. It is also on the third transmission.

When asked about the authenticity, Dan responded:

It is for real, no Photoshop. I think it is absolutely amazing, but most of the service records have gone with the owners, there is not a consistent log.

I have done all of the service myself except for the transmission replacement in the nearly 2 years since I bought it with 750,000+ miles. That has also included 3 timing belt replacements and quite a bit of replacing parts. Twelve timing belt replacements total may be a high estimate, but it has probably had it done at least 8 or 9 times.

We were still wondering if it wasn't a photo of a speedo that was removed from the car, with someone having used a drill to fast-forward the digits. Not wanting to be victims of a clever ruse, we asked Dan if he could supply some proof in the form of service records.

Dan hasn't replied yet.

Here Are All the Features Exclusive to the 2017 Mazda MX-5 Miata RF

The 2017 Mazda MX-5 Miata RF is not simply a hardtop version of the AUTOMOBILE All-Star-winning roadster. It's intended to be a slightly more premium option, too, which means Mazda says the Miata RF will offer several pieces of exclusive content you won't find on any Miata soft-top.

For starters, the 2017 Mazda MX-5 Miata RF gets a unique special color TFT display at the left of its instrument cluster.



Where the soft-top model has only a simple, low-res black-and-white display for the trip computer, fuel level, and temperature gauge, the RF's display shows off more information with bright, crisp details.

interior of the
RF also won't be
offered on the
soft-top car, further contributing to the
premium feel of
the Retractable

Fastback. That's not to say soft-top lovers are left out, as the regular Miata does still offer leather seating on its fully loaded Grand Touring trim level.

Another RF exclusive is the fabulous Machine Gray paint color seen here (and the



forthcoming CX-9): No matter how hard you beg, that color will remain exclusive to the RF version of Mazda's roadster.

In addition, Mazda says that the Miata RF will come standard with blind-spot monitoring and rear cross-traffic alert on all trim levels. On the normal roadster, Mazda offers BSM and RCTA as standard on the Grand Touring trim level.

Of course, there are a few other tweaks involved in adding a power-folding roof to the Miata. Mazda tells us that the 2017 Miata RF also gets unique sound-system tuning, extra sound deadening with acoustic glass, and different suspension tuning compared to the soft-top.

There's still no official pricing or weight information for the 2017 Mazda MX-5 Miata RF, but we can expect those figures over the coming months.

The first deliveries of the 2017 Mazda MX-5 Miata RF to the U.S. should happen in early 2017.







Route 66 could become a giant solar panel



A stretch of Route 66 in Missouri will step well into the 21st century soon when it becomes the first stretch of road in the



Untied States to be covered with pavers that double as solar panels.

The Missouri Department of Transportation applied recently for a grant that would allow



it to test new solar panel "smart pavement" that feeds into the electrical grid and offers a number of other benefits over conventional asphalt and concrete, according to The Kansas City Star. Officials said that they hope to pave a section of road around the Route 66 Welcome Center in



Conway, located in the southwestern corner of the state, by the end of this year.

The result of a crowd-funding initiative a couple of years ago, the pavers that Missouri will use are the creation of inventors Scott and Julie Brusaw. Their firm, Solar Roadways, raised more than \$2 million in

2014 by creating thick tempered glass paving panels that capture the sun's energy.



The panels themselves are designed to be able to deliver the same traction characteristics of pavement, but they contain LED

lights that would eliminate the need for painting road stripes and they also have integrated heating elements capable of melting snow and ice.

It remains to be seen how these pavers will withstand thousands of cars using it daily, the expansion and compression of the earth due to heat and precipitation, or the long-term effects of the sun.



It may, in fact, be better to use these pavers on parking lots first. However, if it works, it's a great energy solution. Here's hoping.

Fiat Spider's Italian flare

Mazda's Miata has been the king of the roadster for 30 years. How does Fiat's fun new offering compare?



ready to take another shot at droptop dominance with the 2017 Fiat 124 Spider. And in the ultimate "ifvou-can't-beat-'em-join-'em" fashion, the 124 Spider is based on the very car it hopes to challenge in the sales race. More than a re-badged Miata Three-anda-half years were spent designing and refining what

The 124 Spider may ride on the same architecture as the fourth-generation Miata, but every bit of bodywork and drivetrain has been swapped out to help set it apart.

If the Mazda MX-5 Miata taught us anything, it's that fun cars don't have to be expensive, complicated or unreliable.

It's been almost 30 years since that car was introduced, and almost 30 years since it forever altered the perception of what a roadster should be. Sure, others came before it — the MGs, Triumphs and Lotuses from Britain; the Alfa Romeos and Fiats from Italy — but Mazda single-handedly resurrected the segment from the ashes in the late 1980s by bringing something those cars didn't: Japanese reliability.

Tired of its roadsters being remembered as little more than relics of bygone days, Fiat is

brand executives hope will be a true halo car for Fiat, and it shows.

The 124 Spider may ride on the fourth generation Miata's architecture, but every bit of bodywork and drivetrain has been swapped out to set it apart from its platform mate.

Like its Mazda sibling, this new Fiat is made from a monocoque unibody with suspension subframes bolted to the front and rear. The two ride on the same 90.9inch wheelbase, though the 124 Spider measures more than five inches longer than the Miata, giving it a decidedly different silhouette hearkening to the Fiat 124 Sport Spider of the 1960s. The overall design follows the course mapped out some 50 years ago, with classic looks that are reserved where the MX-5 is aggressive. If you're looking for a companion

for those new perforated leather driving gloves, the 124 Spider would be it.

Italian escargot

Regardless of trim, all cars come with a 1.4-litre Multi-Air turbo four cylinder under the hood. This powerplant sports forced induction, but it's not the turbocharged Miata that fans have been asking for.

With 160 hp (164 hp in Abarth guise) and 184 lb-ft. of torque, it makes more power than the Miata's 2.0 litre, but not enough to wow. Turbo lag is minute, with the full monty of torque on tap from as low as 2,500 r.p.m.

The standard transmission is a six speed manual, boasting short throws and a friendly clutch. It definitely feels different from the Miata, but not better or worse. Low gears are a touch on the short side but make a nice companion to the 1.4-litre when you feel like banging through the gears.

The available six-speed auto is a bit of a mixed bag: great on the highway, but a touch out of its element when the twisties beckon. Putting it in manual mode helped, forcing the Aisin unit to hold the gears a little longer. However, the steering wheel mounted paddles are only available on automatic Abarths. The transmission could also benefit from a sport setting.

The suspension setup, double wishbone up front and multi-link around back, is soft in the right places and at the right times.

Retuned shocks and springs provide a firm yet comfortable ride, making the 124 Spider equally happy carving up corners as cruising the highway. I found the 124's suspension to be more comfortable than the Miata, but still capable in the corners.

Steering, too, is weighted to allow the car to pull double duty. It is not an adjustable setup, but the electrically power-assisted rack and pinion system is equally light and tight depending on the situation.

Stuck in the comfort zone

The exterior of the 124 Spider stands in stark contrast to Mazda's roadster, but not the interior.

The door panels, to the dashboard and centre stack feel too familiar, down to the infotainment system taken straight from the Mazda and dropped into the Fiat, including console-mounted media controls. This is actually kind of a shame, because FCA's Uconnect is more user-friendly.

The cabin, however, feels a touch tighter than the Miata. An aluminum header in the soft top, designed to reduce wind flutter, does taller drivers no favours for headroom. The verdict: 2017 Fiat 124 Spider If the MX-5 Miata is the standard by which all roadsters are measured, where does that leave this new Fiat?

Everything that makes the Miata so lovable — its light weight, great balance and near-impeccable handling — carries over to the Fiat, making it a viable alternative to a car that has dominated the segment for close to 30 years.

So which one is better? It all boils down to taste.

The Fiat brings the same level of enthusiasm and performance as the Mazda, but in a distinctly Italian package that comes across as slightly more modest. It's unlikely the 124 Spider can overtake the Miata as the king of compact roadsters, but it's certainly a worthy contender in affordable, topless fun.
