A pending trip to Myrtle beach within two days caused the deal to fall through and that particular car was actually sold to another member Wendy Boulay.

This only served to increase the resolve of the Bauldrys to acquire a Miata and it was realized shortly thereafter with the purchase of their 2002 Silver Miata currently parked in their garage. The car was purchased in December of 2006 off of Kijiji (car was located in Woodbridge) and they were only able to clean and look at their baby until the following spring (can you imagine??).

Did You Know? - There is no such thing as a 1998 Miata.

The car we now know as the 1999 Miata (Second Generation or NB) was originally slated to be the '98 model, in fact, it was debuted at the 1998 Detroit Auto Show (January 1998). However due to delays in releasing the product, it was not available to the public at the beginning of 1998. Mazda marketing folks decided it would be best to call it a '99. So if you ever see a '98 Miata for sale, you might want to ask some questions.

Helpful Hints

I recently had a very pleasurable experience at the local Apple Auto Glass shop where I took my Miata in to have a windshield chip repaired. The entire process took about 45 minutes and was handled expertly by John Blackall who is the Manager there. My insurance company gave me a hard time as there is a groundswell to reduce claims of this nature when possible. Typically the \$75 fee is covered by your insurance and you go about your merry way. In my case I was turned down but John who likes Miatas and expressed an interest in the club offered to absorb the fee "because I can".

I have no affiliation with John and had not met him prior to this exchange but it is obvious he's a businessman with his clients well being at heart. Apple will also replace your windshield with a brand new one if required (I thought they were no longer available for the early models!).


