Impromptu Cruise with Ottawa Group




Sunday morning everyone was up early to get to R&L's Bistro for breakfast at 7:30.

Joe & June Riley




Joe and June jumped on the Miata bus in 1993 with the purchase of their first Miata, a 1990 A Package Model they have enjoyed for the past seventeen years.

Our Membership has grown to 20 members as of September and we would like to welcome the following new members:



THE GATEWAY TO MUSKOKA AND BEYOND

Lake Muskoka Circle Tour Start & End @ Gravenhurst Approx. 95 km / 55 miles

About 1 ½ - 3 hours depending on number of stops



- From Gravenhurst, follow Muskoka Road 169 to Bala and Glen Orchard and on to Muskoka Road 118
- Right on Muskoka Road 118 to Port Carling and on through the Huckleberry Rock to Bracebridge (A nice detour: take Milford Bay Road and stop at the parking lot for the Huckleberry Rock Lookout Trail. Take a hike out to marvel at the kilometre-long man-made canyon that 118 winds through.)
- 3. Follow Muskoka Road 118 through Bracebridge to Muskoka Road 17
- 4. Right on Muskoka Road 17 past Muskoka Beach and back into Gravenhurst

Tour Highlights:

- √ The town of Gravenhurst pays tribute to its cultural heritage with its stunningly preserved century Opera House, the lovingly restored birthplace of Chinese hero Dr. Norman Bethune, and the fantastic new Muskoka Wharf where the glory of the historic steam era comes alive alongside some of the best dining and shopping around.
- √ The town of Bala with its roaring falls and fabulous shops & boutiques
- √ The stunning Huckleberry Cut, a man-made canyon over a kilometre long on Muskoka Road 188 between Port Carling & Bracebridge
- √ Regatta Steak And Seafood Grille Gravenhurst

Helpful Hints

Over the years, we've all seen just about everything that can happen to a Miata - good and bad. This section will address new tips and tricks for keeping your Miata new and strong.

- ✓ Unlatch your top latches before unzipping or zipping your rear window every time.
 We've found that the zipper is the thing that fails due to tension on it when the top is latched.
- √ Unzip your rear window every time you drop your top, no exceptions, unless you like a permanent crease in your back window.

Spotlight On

1991 The Beginning of the Special/Limited Editions

Over the years Mazda has introduced a number of Special Edition Miatas using many different names. Initially the Miata in North American was know as the Eunos Roaster in Japan and the MX5 in Europe and elsewhere. Typically the home market (Japan) was the testing grounds for these special models and particularly with the first generation of cars (NAs) the model would be introduced the following year in North America. The home market V Roaster is a prime example as it was introduced in Japan in July 1990 to celebrate the first anniversary of the Euros Roadster.







March 1991 saw the launch of a high spec Special Edition (it was called the Limited Edition in Canada), as the North American equivalent of Japan's V Special. In came only in British Racing Green with a tan interior and boot cover, leather trimmed seats, CD Player, polished tread plates (door sills), power windows, power steering and real wood detaining (Nardi gear knob and emergency brake handle) as standard. All of the features of both the A and B Packages were also included.

This colour was exclusive to this model in North America until 1994. All Canadian Miatas had day-time running lights but the USA versions did not.

Options in Canada included Tan floor mats, tonneau cover and air conditioning. All of these items were standard in the US version along with Cruise Control, Driver's side air bag and a Personalized number plate. Options available in both countries included a removable hardtop and in the USA; Automatic transmission and ABS brakes.

Spotlight On




Every two years there is a meeting of these Special Editions in the U.S.A.. They call it the *Gathering of the Green* (GOG) where owners do what typical Miata owners do drive and talk about their cars. GOG 2009 was held in Michigan and had nearly 30 of these distinctive vehicles in attendance. The meet in 2011 will be held in North Carolina and there is nearly 40 registrations already, pretty impressive for a twenty year old sports car.
