

Angevarre Mazda 2nd Annual Miata Open House

Despite the cool, very wet weather forecast, 8 intrepid souls (7 MoMers + 1 guest, in 5 Miatas), made the sojourn over to Angevaare Mazda in Peterborough for their "2nd Annual Miata Open House", on Sunday June 4th.

Regrettably, the actual weather reflected the forecast pretty closely ... steady and at times heavy rain all the way, and unseasonably cool for early June. Nonetheless, we soldiered on, following some nice county roads southeast through the northern Kawarthas to Hwy. 7 near Lindsay, then along 7 the rest of the way. We made the trek there in about 2 hours from the first rendez-vous point in south Muskoka, and about 1.5 hours from our second meeting spot east of Orillia. Unfortunately, the nasty weather appeared to have taken a toll on the turnout, as there were only about 25 Miatas at the dealership (including our 5) ... substantially fewer than last year, when their entire front display area plus the side parking lot was chock full. Regardless, we made the

best of it, chatting with dealership staff and other Miata attendees, enjoying a tasty

catered BBQ (indoors, in the showroom), and we got to hang out in the back shop, where there was a 2017 Miata RF on display, for us to "kick the tires", sit in, and thoroughly inspect; it was on loan from Mazda Canada HQ in Richmond Hill and

had been driven up to this event by an auto journalist (Lesley Wimbush.)

After lunch, one of the Angevarres led everyone on an afternoon cruise south from Peterborough and all the way around Rice Lake. Our little sub-group of MoM cars (now 4) tagged along at the back of the pack for about half an hour, as far as the village of Keene, where 3 of our group turned north for the trip back home (the 4th car stayed with the main group and completed that guided afternoon cruise.) We took a different route back home, going north through the rolling hills of the eastern Kawarthas, past Lakefield and Young's Point to Burleigh Falls, then west through Buckhorn to Bobcaygeon. We turned north again there, and proceeded to Kinmount, where we stopped for a break, exchanged goodbyes with the 2 Orillia bound cars, and continued our trip home through Minden, Carnarvon and Dorset, west to Baysville, then north to Huntsville. The trip back from Peterborough (via Keene) to Huntsville took us slightly over 2.5 hours, so it ended up being a fairly full day.
