Midland Cruise - Sept. 18




The trip down the west side of the lake took us to the Marriott Resort where the group took a brief walk around this five star resort before heading south into Port Carling under increasingly darker

Helpful Hints - Headlight Restoration

The wrath of time can have an alarming effect on your Miata and the perfect example would be the deterioration of your headlight lenses. Over time these lenses become foggy which not only reduces the appearance factor of your baby but also the illumination which could become a safety factor.

Most modern headlamp housings are treated with a very hard coating on the exterior to resist wear and tear from road debris and UV. They also get an anti-fog coating on the interior. Once the hard coat is compromised a common practice is to sand the rest of it and the resultant oxidation away, leaving behind a clean but vulnerable surface.

So you can do this at home, all you need is:

Some 600, 1200, and 2000 grit sandpaper.

Spray bottle filled with water.

Some sort of polish (eg. Mother's mag wheel polish)

Clear coat spray paint

Hair dryer.

Some Carnuba wax.


Start off wet sanding the lenses with 600 grit, some enthusiasts have even sanded all the external writing on the housing for a cleaner appearance. Move up the grits slowly making sure you sand the entire surface adequately and to keep the housing wet at all times.

After you've gone through the sand paper go ahead and clear coat it. Make sure to warm the can of clear up with warm water because the paint will lay better.

After one semi heavy coat of clear, dry it with the hair dryer, scuff it with 2000 grit sand paper and shoot it with a heavy coat of clear almost to the point of running and dried that with the hair dryer. This is what I started with. clear coat seals it so it doesn't re fog as fast and the clear actually fills in the tiny crevices and makes it extremely clear.


Put some polish on a buffer of some sort (an orbital buffer works fine) and press the light housing to it. You don't have to put a lot of force on the housing it just takes time.... about 20 minutes minimum. You just have to have patience. Wipe off the excess polish very well then put the carnuba wax on the light and let it dry to a haze, wipe it off and voila you have an almost new housing.



2011 Special Edition

To mark the 900,000 units of the Mazda MX-5 Miata sold, Mazda is celebrated the milestone with the introduction of the 2011 Mazda MX-5 Miata Special Edition at the Chicago Auto Show in February. Available only as a fully loaded power retractable hard top and a limited production of only 750 units. (U.S.A. version, substantially fewer in Canada)



The Special Edition is based off of a fully-equipped Grand Touring model but is only available with the Power Retractable Hard Top (PRHT). Externally the these vehicles are were available in two new MX-5 colours only, Sparkling Black Mica or Dolphin Grey Mica, and are packaged with 17-inch Bright Finish aluminium alloy ten-spoke wheels.

Special Edition-exclusive interior touches include grey door trim and heated leather seats with grey stitching, a black leather-wrapped parking brake and steering wheel with contrasting grey stitching, chrome treatments to the air vents and instrument cluster as well as aluminium pedals.

Mazda also beefed up the performance of the MX-5 Special Edition a bit by adding the Suspension Package which includes Bilstein® shocks, a limited-slip differential (LSD) and sport-tuned dampers. And in the power train department, is power is supplied by a 2.0-liter four-cylinder engine producing 167 horsepower and 140 lb-feet of torque in a six-speed manual transmission, or 158 horsepower when equipped with a six-speed automatic transmission.

The Premium Package is standard on the Special Edition and includes a Bluetooth® hands-free phone system, SIRIUS® Satellite Radio with a six-month complimentary subscription, Xenon headlights, Dynamic Stability Control (DSC) with a Traction Control System (TCS), an anti-theft alarm and the Mazda Advanced Keyless Entry and Start System.
